SUBJECT: Disqualifying Convictions

The Following are the reasons why a security guard license would not be issued by the Board, based on criminal history.

<u>Felony Convictions</u>: Any person convicted of a felony offense will not be eligible for a license from the Board, <u>unless a full pardon has been granted</u>. For information on pardons go to <u>www.pardons.state.al.us</u>

<u>Misdemeanor Convictions:</u> Any person convicted of a misdemeanor offense involving moral turpitude or any similar offense, excluding all sexual and violent offenses (see Section (b) and (c)), will not be eligible for a license from the Board within five (5) calendar years of their most recent conviction, unless a full pardon has been granted.

- (a) Any person convicted of a misdemeanor violent offense will not be eligible for a license from the Board within (10) calendar years of their most recent conviction, unless a full pardon has been granted.
- (b) Any person convicted of a misdemeanor sexual offense will not be eligible for a license from the Board, unless a full pardon has been granted.

The Board will not issue or renew a license to any person who is required to register as a sex offender in any State or competent jurisdiction. The Board will not issue or renew Armed Security Officer license or Certified Trainer 2 certification to any person who is prohibited from possessing a firearm by any section of any state law or the federal Gun Control Act of 1968 (18 U.S.C. Chapter 44), as amended.

<u>Moral turpitude</u>. For the purposes of the Act, this term shall mean any $\dot{\tau}$ sexual offense, violent offense, controlled substance or narcotics offense, or any offense involving theft, theft of services, extortion, receiving stolen property, identity theft, forgery, fraud, tampering with records, bribery, perjury, or any similar offense in any jurisdiction.
